## Instantaneous and proactive communication from local law enforcement to you

The **Alert Network** allows Travis County to instantly update you about crimes, emergencies and other important information.

- **Citizen Alerts** inform all registered users of public safety concerns in your area. The Alerts contain details including complete descriptions, actions to take and when possible photographs. Alerts are delivered via e-mail to your inbox and or digital device.
- **Business Alerts** are targeted to specific business types, so your business will receive information about crimes that are pertinent to your business type. Alerts are delivered via fax, and e-mail to your inbox and or digital device.
- **Case Alerts** allows law enforcement to automatically disseminate information about open cases to all registered CitizenObserver users. Alerts are delivered via e-mail to your inbox and or digital device.
- **Watch Group Alerts** allow law enforcement to send targeted alerts to specific neighborhoods with information about crimes that are happening in their immediate area. Alerts are delivered via e-mail to your inbox and or digital device.

## Two-Way Communication between the public and local law enforcement

Possibly the biggest benefit of the Alert Network is the way it make possible two-way communication between law enforcement and the public.

- Law Enforcement can **update citizens** on situations that require their attention.
