On this, the 29 day of August, A.D. 1945, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 25 day of August, A.D. 1945, in Travis County, upon the question of determining whether horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large in certain territorial limits, more particularly described as follows: Travis County, State of Texas;

And it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 3 511 votes, of which number there were cast:

FOR THE STOCK LAW	3, 207	votes
AGAINST THE STOCK LAW	304	votes

And it appearing to the Court from said returns that a majority of the legally qualified voters of said District, voting at said election, voted FOR THE STOCK LAW, the Court does hereby declare the proposition to have been adopted, and after the expiration of thirty days from the date of this proclamation it shall be unlawful to permit horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle to run at large within the territorial limits hereinbefore designated.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

Whereas, an election was held on the 25th day of August, A.D. 1945, within and throughout the territorial limits of the County of Travis, State of Texas, upon the question of determining whether horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle shall be permitted to run

at large within said Travis County, Texas;

And whereas, the Official Returns of said election have been duly canvassed according to law, by the County Judge, a Justice of the Peace, and the County Clerk of said County;

And it appearing that the said election was in all respects legally held and that the returns were duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 3,511 votes, of which number there were cast:

FOR THE STOCKLAW	3,207	votes
AGAINST THE STOCK LAW	304	votes

And it appearing that a majority of the legally qualified voters of Travis County, voting at said election, voted FOR THE STOCK LAW,

THEREFORE, I do hereby declare the proposition to have been adopted, and after the expiration of thirty days from the date of this proclamation it shall be unlawful to permit horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle to run at large within the territorial limits of Travis County, Texas.
